We're sharing the latest news about our work at the Leashaw landslip.

Major step forward as tender for Leashaw repairs finalised for publication

We'll be inviting companies to bid to carry out the repairs to the Leashaw landslip next week, when we publish the full tender for the works.

The 272 page tender document will be available online from Monday (next week) for up to 5 weeks on the ProActis public sector tender portal.

Companies interested in bidding for the work will be able to review the document to finalise their quote to install micro concrete piles at the foot of the landslip collapse.

The tenders will then be checked and evaluated by our highways team of engineers, with a final contract award likely to be made in May this year.

A brief mobilisation period will follow to ready the site for work, with a materials and equipment compound set up before work starts towards the end of May this year.

We expect the work to take around 20 weeks, subject to weather conditions and any unforeseen issues on site requiring additional attention.

We continue to keep local County Councillor Rachael Hatchett and Dethick, Lea and Holloway Parish Council representatives updated with progress and to address issues they raise on behalf of the local community.

We'd like to thank local people and businesses for their patience during the road closure and our detailed site investigations.

As we shared in our last newsletter, the road closure has been temporarily extended until December this year to allow the works to take place. Please check One Network for further details using this link:
